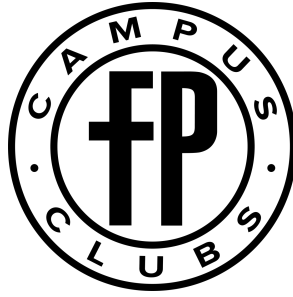

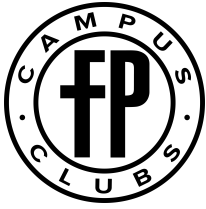

FIRST PRIORITY CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

Article I – Name of the Club

The First Priority Club of _____ School.

Article II – Purpose of the Club

- To encourage friends to understand the importance of living in relationship with God, serve as a resource to help students enhance their spiritual lives, and provide an opportunity to integrate beliefs into daily living.
- To encourage students to grow in their relationship with God, live out their faith daily, and share the hope of Christ with others on their campus while also providing opportunities for students to grow in their faith, develop as leaders, and make a positive impact in their school and community.

Article III – Qualifications for Club Attendees

Club participation is open to all students at this school who wish to attend. All attendees will adhere to the policies set in place by the school for student Clubs (i.e., school permission slips).

Article IV – Student Leadership Expectations

- Our Student Leaders have an active relationship with Jesus Christ and strive to uphold the character of Christ in their everyday lives. Student Leaders will consistently show up to Club and encourage others. (1 Timothy 4:12)
- Our team of Student Leaders carries out the following duties, including, but not limited to: greeting, promoting Club, hosting, speaking, serving food, making announcements, and following up with their peers.
- Our Club may or may not have individuals holding positions of office, depending on our school's requirements.

Article V – Meetings

- Our meetings are student-led, in accordance with the Equal Access Act (20 U.S.C. 4071-74), passed by Congress in 1984.
- Our meetings occur weekly and are coordinated with our faculty sponsor.
- Our meetings provide students the opportunity to discover and develop leadership skills.
- Our four-week rotation of meetings equips, encourages, and empowers students to live out their faith at school and in their community.

Article VI – Affiliation

- Our Club is affiliated with First Priority of America, a non-profit ministry that resources Clubs to succeed in their stated purpose.
- First Priority enlists volunteers to attend Club meetings as invited guests to help Student Leaders fulfill their assigned tasks.
- All First Priority approved volunteers will have completed school district volunteer forms and First Priority annual trainings, background checks, and child abuse prevention.

Article VII – Amendments

Amendments to this Constitution/By-Laws may be proposed by any member. Amendments shall become effective if approved by two-thirds of the First Priority of America Executive Staff.
